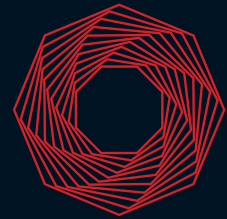

Rt Revd Stephen Conway

Bishop of Ely

The Rt Revd Stephen Conway was installed as the 69th Bishop of Ely on 5 March 2011. Bishop Stephen was ordained priest in 1987 and spent the whole of his parochial ministry in the Diocese of Durham. While serving there, he was appointed as Diocesan Director of Ordinands and later as the Bishop of Durham's Senior Chaplain & Diocesan Communications Officer. In 2002 he became Archdeacon of Durham and Canon Treasurer of the Cathedral. Following his consecration in June 2006, he served in the Diocese of Salisbury as Bishop of Ramsbury.



Warren East CBE

Warren East was CEO for ARM Holdings plc from 2001 to 2013. Warren is a Chartered Engineer, a Companion of the Chartered Management Institute and a Fellow of both the Institution of Engineering and Technology and the Royal Academy of Engineering. He is also a Distinguished Fellow of the British Computer Society. He is senior non-executive director and chairman of the audit committee of De La Rue plc, and a non-executive director of Micron inc, Dyson Limited, BT plc and Rolls Royce plc. He chairs the ESCO (Electronic Systems Community) Council and leadership forum and is on the board of the Connected Digital Economy Catapult.
